On Friday, May 17, 2013 the network Little Constellation-Contemporary Art in the geo-cultural micro-areas and small states of Europe will open a new exhibition at the National Gallery of Iceland, Subjective Maps/Disappearances, scheduled from May 17 to June 30, 2013.

Little Constellation is an international network for contemporary art. It was founded for the creation and dissemination of research projects especially attentive to the present in the small states of Europe: Andorra, Cyprus, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, Montenegro, San Marino, and in some micro geo-cultural areas of the European Union including: Ticino, Ceuta, Gibraltar, Kaliningrad, the Aland Islands, the Faroe Islands, Jersey and Guernsey. The network is proposed as an international cognitive platform for the dissemination of information, exhibitions, meetings and residencies for artists and to encourage the creation of co-productions and collaborations for new projects with artists, associations, museums, art centres, public and private institutions and international foundations.

The **37 artists** in the exhibition produced a series of artist's book and fanzine, inspired by the disappearance theme, as a condition of suspended between geopolitical reasons and a more private and existential dimension. Works have been designed with an idea of creating a narrative, both visual and textual, able to tell different identities, anthropological and cultural belonging to territories involved in the network.

An integral part of the exhibition will be the volume issued by **Mousse Publishing**, designed as an artist's book, an anthology of all the work produced for the occasion by artists.

Works will be exhibited in an installation specifically designed for the central hall of the museum by the Swiss artist **Oppy De Bernardo**, with the idea of making visible and tangible, through the use of simple construction materials, the size of the network, characteristic of Little Constellation. Work is presented as a display to accommodate and expose the show's fanzine *Subjective Maps* but also give the whole room a specific and recognizable visual characterization.

The exhibition, curated by Halldór Björn Runólfsson, director of the National Gallery of Iceland, Alessandro Castiglioni, Rita Canarezza & Pier Paolo Coro, curators and artists of the *Little Constellation* network, is supported by the institutions of San Marino and Iceland with the participation of the institutions of Cyprus, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Montenegro, Gibraltar, the Aland Islands, the Faroe Islands, Jersey and Guernsey.

The exhibition forms part of the Reykjavik Arts Festival, 2013, Iceland's first international cultural festival.

Subjective Maps / Disappearances is an atlas: a collection of maps made by artists who work in certain specific territories of Europe, small states and geopolitical micro-areas that belong to the Little Constellation network.

But mapmaking is a form of storytelling, so these maps are presented in the guise of that cultural archetype for the transmission and preservation of knowledge: the book, found for this exhibition in a range of possible reformulations such as fanzine, object, and artist's book. Disappearance is a term that spontaneously emerged during a discussion with Halldór Björn Runólfsson, Director of the National Gallery of Iceland, which is housing the show connected to this publication, during a workshop held in Reykjavik in November 2011. The focus on this word generated a series of insights, some linked to the narrative tradition of Iceland. Indeed, one cannot help but note the importance in Icelandic folklore and mythology of that vast Book of Imaginary Beings so that fascinated Jorge Luis Borges, teeming with elves and trolls, creatures that are invisible-or visible, insofar as their presence is intensely felt-real or imaginary, lurking within or springing from the unconscious. Each of these presences is capable of conveying the deep human need for a multiplicity of archetypal visions, and the broader need to conceive and tell stories that can take on new forms in the present. Now more than ever, these insights

and sensations are facets of a compelling necessity to preserve every form of imagination, as a way of countering the very concept of disappearance.

Building on these ideas, certain aspects were singled out as starting points for this study of "disappearance". The first has to do with the metaphoric connotation of the idea as it relates to a sociopolitical and economic condition. Nowadays, must a small community, embedded in a context of international institutions, fear erasure?

For an individual who is part of a social system, what it mean to disappear? These questions served as points of departure for a stage of discussion and dialogue that this book documents through the contributions of each artist.

And the artists, with their various subjective maps, usher us into an individual, mirror-like atlas of the emotions, experienced within the specific geopolitical and geocultural contexts we address. or like fanciful adventure stories, take us in search of mysterious, faraway worlds yet to be explored.
